PLAYER CODE OF CONDUCT

Player Commitment

As UWA is a competitive club, players are expected to train and play each week (unless injured). Therefore, if you will be absent for more than two games or training sessions, please do not register but complete the reserves list form on our website.

UWA players in the Open category are required to take on either coaching or umpiring duties - this is nonnegotiable. If you choose not to coach, you will be assigned to umpire at least four games during the season. Please do not register if you are not willing to accept this condition. Training, support and assistance is provided throughout the season.

Players failing to complete their umpiring duties without arranging a replacement umpire and not advising the Umpiring Coordinator, will not be permitted to play until a penalty of \$100 is paid to UWA Netball Club.

Behaviour and Conduct

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of fellow players, coaches, officials and spectators.
- Refrain from conduct which could be regarded as sexual or other harassment.
- Respect the talent, potential and development of fellow players and competitors.
- Care and respect the uniform and equipment provided to you.
- Be frank and honest with your coach concerning illness and injury and your ability to train and play fully.
- Conduct yourself in a responsible manner relating to language, temper and punctuality.
- Maintain a high standard of personal behaviour at all times.
- Abide by the rules and respect the decision of the umpires. Be courteous and use the correct process when seeking a rule clarification.
- Be honest in your attitude and preparation to training. Work equally hard for yourself and your team.
- Cooperate with coaches and staff in relation to programs that adequately prepare you for competition.

- Accept responsibility for your spectators and ensure they abide by this code of conduct.
- Do not engage in practices that affect sporting performance (alcohol, tobacco and drug use).
